There's certainly truth to that, especially when it comes to stewardship. While we are here on this earth, God has appointed us to be faithful stewards of his creation. He gives us his Word to help us in that task. Not only does the Word lay out some general guidelines for stewardship, but it also reminds us of what gives us the strength and the ability to follow these guidelines. Especially when we are talking about our church offerings, it is critical to remember God's unending grace to us in his Son Jesus, our Savior. That is what leads us to be faithful stewards, and to say along with the apostle Paul, "Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!" (2 Corinthians 9:15).
